# Kathleen Walsh Designs an Eclectic Townhouse Inspired by an Art Collection

The resulting mix is a continual conversation starter

New York City apartments aren't known for their privacy—especially if you have street-facing windows. Such was the case for <u>Kathleen Walsh's</u> clients in Manhattan's West Village. "It is one of those apartments that you walk by and look up and kind of wonder what's inside," says the designer of the five-story townhouse. If passers-by do happen to catch a glimpse inside these windows, however, they'll be greeted with all kinds of art and personality.

"It's such an eclectic group of art throughout the house, and it's very reflective of who the clients are," says Walsh. The collection, amassed over years of travel and a serious buying habit, served as a springboard for her design. Grass greens, sky blues, and wheaty neutrals came to the forefront. A prominent modern sculpture in the mix led Walsh to choose funky silhouettes that somehow still felt right at home with the 19th-century architecture. "They're all individual choices and individual pieces," she says, "but put together it really creates its own conversation and cohesive style."

Eclectic is the word that sums up the finished look of this home—and it's Walsh's favorite way to describe it ("I'm using it in its best sense," she says). Genres and style blur together, anchored by form and color. But there's rhyme and reason behind every one of her decisions. "With careful placement," she explains, "all these crazy pieces from different eras and styles can really speak well to one another and create a conversation that is unexpected, and, to me, that embodies everything about living in a place like New York."

# **Living Room**



The living room is the clearest example of Walsh riffing on the owner's art. "The chandelier form is a slight reference to the sculpture in the corner," she reveals.
